State, county issue warnings on rainbow fentanyl By: Jimmy Knodel

Public health and law enforcement agencies throughout California have issued warnings on a recent trend of brightly-colored fentanyl pills being distributed. Rainbow fentanyl comes in a variety of colors (yellow, blue, red) and resembles candy or sidewalk chalk, making it appealing to school-age children. Fentanyl is an opioid that is the leading cause of death of children 17 years and younger, and a lethal dose is just 2 mg in size.

Talking Points for Legislative Chairs, October 2022 *at the time of publication of this report, the November *Advocacy Communicator* was not available

Details are in the October issue of the Advocacy Communicator.

- · PTA is nonpartisan, meaning we don't support or oppose candidates. However, we can encourage people to register to vote, provide information about <u>all</u> of the candidates in a school board race through a candidate forum or questionnaire, and encourage people to vote.
- PTA does take positions on legislative bills and ballot propositions. California State PTA is urging a yes vote on Prop. 28, which provides funding for music and arts education at all public schools, and Prop. 31, which would approve a law banning flavored tobacco products.
- Sacramento Safari will be in the state capitol February 27 and 28, 2023. The cost is about \$800 per person, but actually being in Sacramento makes it a much more meaningful experience as compared to being on Zoom. Are we sending someone from our PTA?
- · General Election voting in Orange County begins around October 10, when the Registrar of Voters begins mailing out ballots to all registered voters. You can return your ballot by mailing it or depositing it in a Ballot Drop Box. Or you can vote at any Voter Center in Orange County.
- The Communicator has an explanation of where the funding for our schools comes from. It might surprise you.
- AB 1614, which was sponsored by California State PTA, did not pass during the legislative session that recently ended. The bill would have increased the base grant in the Local Control Funding Formula. It may be re-introduced in the next legislative session.
- The next Advocacy Forum is scheduled for November 18 at 9:30 a.m. Put the date on your calendar. These forums are always very interesting and informative.

In State News:

The next General Election is this Tuesday, November 8, 2022!

Vote Centers are open and are available to anyone wishing to vote in person or to drop off a completed VBM ballot. There are also multiple official OC Registrar of Voters "Ballot drop boxes" to return your completed ballot. Visit ocvote.gov for a list of voting centers and drop boxes.

CA BALLOT Initiatives: CAPTA Takes a SUPPORT Position on these ballot measures:

California State PTA is urging yes votes on two of the propositions on the November ballot.

Prop 28 would provide new funding to assure that all students in kindergarten through high school get arts and music instruction.

Prop. 31 is a referendum that asks voters to approve SB 793, which bans the sale of flavored tobacco products. CAPTA is a strong supporter of SB 793 because flavored tobacco products are enticing many of our young people to begin smoking. Tobacco companies have spent more than \$21 million to try to keep this law from going into effect. Vote "yes" to enforce the ban of the sale of flavored tobacco products.

<u>CUSD will be in these State Senate Districts:</u> we are going from 1 to 3 - with Districts 36, 37, and 38. All elected officials will be new to us. Senator Bates has termed out and is running for the OC Board of Supervisors seat in November.

Education on fentanyl, other drugs often optional in California schools, if offered at all by Carolyn Jones Edsource

Even as fentanyl overdoses among young people have skyrocketed in recent years, health education remains optional in most California schools, with some students receiving comprehensive education on the dangers of substance use and other students receiving scant, if any, instruction on the topic.

*Note: this article uses the word "overdose". Amy Neville and other parent advocates that educate the public on this substance, refer to it as a poison. "Fentanyl poisoning" is a term that is more commonly used now.
